LIVE THE LITURGY: Disobedience and Hope in the Garden of Eden

On the 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time, we see God confronting Adam and Eve after their disobedience in the Garden of Eden. They had eaten the forbidden fruit, and now they faced the consequences. God tells them what will happen because of their actions, but He also gives a promise.
